THE FEMALE CONTRACEPTIVE BENEFIT

Oral contraception, contraceptive rings, contraceptive patches, certain contraceptive injections as well as IUDs, including Mirena[®], are covered from Risk on all Bonitas options. Pharmacy Direct is the Designated Service Provider for Contraceptives except on BonComprehensive, BonSave, BonFit Select, Standard, Primary, BonStart and BonStart Plus. They will deliver your medicine to your home, work or to the nearest Post Office, depending on your needs, at no extra cost. IUDs, including the Mirena[®] device, are also paid from Risk but this excludes the doctor's consultation and cost of procedure, which will be paid from the member's day-to-day benefits or available savings. The benefit for IUDs is available once every two years and the Mirena once every five years.

HOW MUCH CAN I SPEND?

The amount allocated to this benefit depends on the plan you have chosen:
